A short Reflection on 'Gentleness':
This Sunday's Gospel present's Jesus as offering hospitality to two of John the Baptist's disciples. One of them is Andrew who becomes a disciple of Jesus. Jesus invites them into his life and they spend 'the rest of the day' with him. We are not given the details of what took place during these hours but Andrew was excited enough to tell his brother, Simon Peter about this encounter with hope and enthusiasm. We can assume that one trait that they encountered in Jesus was his gentleness. Henri Nouwen offers this reflection titled, 'Dressed In

Gentleness': "Once in a while we meet a gentle person. Gentleness is a virtue hard to find in a society that admires toughness and roughness. We are encouraged to get things done and to get them done fast, even when people get hurt in the process. Success, accomplishment, and productivity count. But the cost is high. There is no place for gentleness in such a milieu. Gentle is the one who does 'not break the crushed reed, or snuff the faltering wick" (Matthew 12:20). Gentle is the one who is attentive to the strengths and weaknesses accomplishing something. A gentle person treads lightly, listens carefully, looks tenderly, and touches with reverence. A gentle person knows that true growth requires nurture, not force. Let's dress ourselves with gentleness. In our tough and often unbending world our gentleness can be a vivid reminder of the presence of God among us." Bread for the Journey, Fr. Henri Nouwen

Revitalization & Realignment - Continuing the Conversation #6

Why Are We Doing This?

In any project it helps periodically to reflect on why we are doing this. There are many factors that have brought us to this point – declining population, aging communities, movement of people from one area to another, shortages of priests, the need to carry out ministry and pastoral care in new ways, financial considerations to name a few. But one, a new vision of the Catholic Church has been expressed by Pope Francis.

Pope Francis expressed this new vision in 2013 shortly after he became pope. In his exhortation to all Catholics, <u>The Joy of the Gospel</u> Pope Francis called on all Christians, including Catholics to a "renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ". As he put it: "Being a Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction." In this he was quoting his predecessor, Pope Benedict XVI. It is this encounter with a person, Jesus Christ that energizes us as disciples to become missionaries of Good News to our world.

In <u>The Joy of the Gospel</u> Pope Francis expressed this vision this way: "I dream of a 'missionary option', that is a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything, so that the Church's customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be suitably channeled for the evangelization of today's world rather than her self-preservation." (27) In short the Church, the whole Church, universal and local must become about mission, not maintenance.

Pope Francis has expressed a new vision of how we are to be Church in the midst of the world in the 21st century. This vision calls for each and every person, laity and clergy to carry the Good News to the whole world. At the local level it will mean communities that are revitalized and active, that gather many different generations, children, seniors, youths and middle age. Being Catholic will mean more than going to Mass on Sunday. It will mean we will all be missionary disciples of Jesus ready to share what we have received. In doing so, we become the face of God to our world.

Why are we doing this? Why are working for revitalization & realignment? Because we aspire and hope to grow stronger as the Church we are called to be – communities of missionary disciples able to share the full joy of the Gospel.
