

NOTE FROM FR. BILL:

Recently the Bishop announced the Parish Changes for the Diocese and had his 'Pastoral letter for Revitalizing the Diocese of Saint John for Discipleship and Evangelization' read at each Mass throughout the Diocese. Copies of the pastoral letter are at the entrances of the church.

The following change is happening for St. Dunstan's:

Fredericton South, New Maryland and Fredericton Junction (2 Priests).

The parishes of St. Dunstan's (Fredericton) and Sts. John and Paul (New Maryland) will be merged into one new parish effective September 1st, 2018. St. Dunstan's Church and Sts. John and Paul Church will serve as worship sites. St. Columba's Church (Fredericton Junction) will be a mission church of this parish.

The following is our diocesan 'Vision for a Revitalized Church'

Vision of a Revitalized Church Living out our Baptismal Call:

- An evangelizing community that gives Jesus Christ to the world.
- Full churches for Sunday Mass
- Intergenerational community of children, teens, young adults, middle-age, seniors.
- The Centre of the community life service those on the margin and most in need.
- A community of growing disciples who share their faith, support one another, and lead other to Jesus Christ.

We are asked to pray with this vision using the following format:

A suggested Way to Pray and attend to our 'Vision of a Revitalized Church'

Personal Prayer:

- -Take five minutes to settle and be conscious of you and God in the presence of one another.
- -Read the entire 'Vision' reflectively and sit with it for a minute or two.
- -Sit reflectively with one statement and notice your thoughts, memories and ideas.
- -Sit reflectively with the same statement and notice what is happening in your 'heart' / your 'affect'.
- -Take a minute to write down what happened.

(Do this for five consecutive days so you can pray with each statement of the Vision. Pray with a different statement each day).

(Do this prayer periodically).

Living as a Community of Disciples We Are a Mixed Bag – Yet Loving One Another (Fr. John Jennings)

Sitting at Mass and looking around on Pentecost Sunday it was apparent that we are a very "mixed bag". All ages, all sizes, all colours, races and cultures were together, united by a shared faith. We are indeed a "mixed bag". Yet our very presence in this community speaks of a shared commitment and connection to this Church, this community of faith. We are united as disciples of Jesus, the Christ.

The two feasts of the Trinity and of the Body and Blood of the Lord, help us to recognize what it is that allows us to stand as a community of disciples. At the core of our faith stands this mystery of the Trinity, three persons in one God. Not an easy thing to explain, but perhaps that is not the point. Perhaps it is more important that we come to recognize what it means for us.

What does it mean to hold a belief in God as three persons yet one God? Can we recognize that for the Christian, God is all about a loving relationship - of Father, Son and Holy Spirit? It is this God who pours out love upon all creation. It is this God who, in an expression of love for all humanity, sent the Son to share our humanity and live among us in Jesus.

Christian faith tells us we are created in God's image. As the Trinity is an expression of God's love, so we are the reflection of our loving God in the midst of creation. Discipleship to Jesus calls us to live and share this image, reflecting the image of a loving God. The Risen Jesus called his disciples: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matt 28:19)

As our diocese experiences realignment in order to revitalize it will be important to recognize that like our ancestors we are called to reveal our loving God in our own time and place. This calls for a generosity of spirit as we come together. It demands a readiness to see who we are and express it in our willingness to live and act as communities of Christians.

The early Christians made their mark on the world of their time and place by being the image of the loving Father, Son and Spirit. The 3rd century writer Tertullian urged his fellow Christians as such examples of loving communities. Their world should be able to remark: "See how they love one another."

Tertullian was simply telling them to live what Jesus told his disciples: "Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:34-35). Will it be said of us, the Catholics of our own time and place, that we reveal God's image by the way we live our love for one another?

For your reflection:

Jean Vanier addressed the bishops of the Lambeth Conference of the Anglican Communion on July 30, 1998 with a meditation on the meaning of the washing of feet. The following is a brief quote from this insightful meditation:

"We are to touch people with a deep respect to touch them with tenderness. Our hands, and not just our voices, may become vehicles of the love of Jesus. The Word became flesh, that our flesh may become word. Our flesh, through the power of the Holy Spirit, can reveal to people their value that they are cherished and loved by God.

Our hands are, in some mysterious way, a source of revelation of communion. Jesus, as he knelt down in front of the feet of his disciples, knows that tomorrow he will be dead. But he wants to have with each disciple a moment. Not just to say goodbye.

Up until now he has just talked with the group.

When you talk with a whole group you don't have that individual contact with each person. Jesus wants that contact with each one of these people.

He wants to touch them; to touch their feet; to touch their bodies; to touch them with tenderness and love. Maybe to each one he says a word; maybe looks each one in the eye. There is a moment of communion.

So, there is communion through the Body of Christ, where Jesus says "do this in memory of me." But there is also this communion as he kneels at their feet. And later he will say "I have done this as an example for you. And what I have done to you, you must do one to another." So, this is a gesture of communion, of tenderness."
