In addition to the wisdom you carry yourself and the wisdom of hundreds of other inspiring folks that you have interacted with this past week, the following three women might carry some inspiration for you in these quotes and some further reading of their work.

From **Sr. Helen Prejean**, C.S.J. who is a Roman Catholic nun, a member of the Congregation of St. Joseph based in New Orleans, who through her ministry in prisons has accompanied prisoners on death row and has given them a loving face and presence in their dying moments. Author of <u>Dead Man Walking:</u>

- "I saw the suffering and I let myself feel it... I saw the
 injustice and was compelled to do something about
 it. I changed from being a nun who only prayed for
 the suffering world to a woman with my sleeves
 rolled up, living my prayer."
- "I watch what I'm doing to see what I believe."
- "people are more than the worst thing they have ever done in their lives"
- "The important thing is that when your come to understand something you act on it, no matter how small that act is. Eventually it will take you where you need to go."
- "I want the last face you see in this world to be the face of love, so you look at me when they do this thing. I'll be the face of love for you." (to a death row prisoner before his execution).

From Sister of Mercy theologian and professor of spirituality, **Sr. Janet Ruffing**, R.S.M., Ph.D., who teaches graduate courses on Christian spirituality, mystics and mysticism, and meditation at Yale Divinity School.

We are too busy to be addressed personally by the social, political or ecological disasters occurring in our relationships. We are too busy to listen to our own feelings or those of others.
