Christmas Message from Fr. Bill: 'JOY' has been a theme that has held my attention during my reflections on the Scriptures these past days of Advent and looking forward to our Christmas Masses.

Long before Jesus was born, the people of Israel longed for a 'Messiah' to come into their midst and bring them 'Joy'. The prophet Isaiah predicted that the 'One —who- would- come' would increase the people's joy. (Isaiah 9:2-4) When Jesus began his ministry he declared that he was 'The One' and in the Gospel of John 15:11, Jesus says, "I have told you these things so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete." The following is a short and incomplete list of what Jesus told them about joy through his words and actions:

-joy is in the birth of children and the companioning of them with love and support throughout their lives.

-joy is in the choice to become friends, sisters and brothers.... even with our enemies.

-joy is in the sharing of our lives mutually and compassionately with the vulnerable and assuring that our economic, political relationships are equitable, fair and inclusive.

-joy is in noticing and being in awe of what has become ordinary and 'just a part of the scenery' around us, which mostly goes unnoticed and unappreciated. Taking from the parable of the 'mustard seed', Jesus gave us the best lesson on joy. All we need to do is reflect on one tree in our environment and notice the miracle of it beginning as a small seed growing into an amazing creation... 'This is JOY'.

We might do well to sit reflectively and gaze on our Christmas tree (even if it is artificial) and allow it to take us outdoors to a single tree and notice what God is doing in our world billions and billions of times in the tree world....and then be led to think of this being the case with every human being. Then ponder the Christmas miracle that each of us knows the gift of 'joy' within us and we can have it more abundantly if we foster joy within us and others through following what Jesus has told us in the list above.

It might also be helpful to make you own list of where and how you have found joy during Advent and are noticing and experiencing joy these 12 days of Christmas. Right now as I write this, I can hear the joy of people gathered in the gymnasium preparing the Christmas Exchange in sponsoring 80 families. I also am recalling the joy of a gathering of our parish in this same gymnasium this past January with the Al Khleif family and other Syrian families to celebrate the gift for us all in assisting their settlement in Canada. These will definitely be on my 'joy' list.

Merry Christmas to you all and many thanks for being an instrument of God's joy and love to me and others this past year!

Note from Fr. Bill regarding weekend Masses:

Please take note that we now have three weekend Masses instead of four as follows: beginning this weekend, the First Sunday of Advent, Saturday @ 5:00 pm, Sunday @ 9:00am and 11:30am. There will be NO 7:00 pm Mass. The reason for this change is due to the new Mass schedule at St. Thomas University which now has Mass on Sunday evening @ 7:00pm. On the main floor of Holy Cross House on Montgomery Street.

Note from Fr. Bill: During this time of restructuring and revitalizing in our Diocese, we are being invited to pray with the Sunday Gospel each week by using the method of 'Lectio Divina'. We had an information and practice session with this method of prayer this past Wednesday with 30 people attending. There are pamphlets describing what Lectio Divina (Divine Reading) is and the steps to follow when praying it as an individual or in a small group. These pamphlets are available on the Adult Faith Formation Bulletin Board in the Parish Center. It is easy to follow. Pick one up and give it a try. If you would like to join a group to pray this once or twice a week, just leave your name at the Parish Office (444-6001).

Kitchen Renovation: The Kitchen Renovation is complete! Feel free to drop by and take a look at our beautiful new kitchen. At our last Annual Parish Meeting (April 2017) we let you know that the kitchen would be renovated at a cost of \$55K plus tax. In order to adhere to building codes and food safety policies this renovation required a complete upgrading to our kitchen structure including electrical, plumbing, counter tops, cabinets and flooring. The cost will actually be \$101 K with tax included. At that Parish Meeting, we were asked by some of those in attendance to put out an invitation to parishioners requesting donations towards this project. Given that we have not approached parishioners for over 6 years for assistance with any of the many projects we have done at the cost of \$814K, it seems timely that we make this request once again. We have relied heavily on our investments to fund all of the projects we have undertaken. We are now looking to fund some of our new projects, including this kitchen renovation, through new funding from whatever you are able to contribute. With the bulletin several weekends ago, Fr. Bill included a letter to parishioners detailing all of the capital projects we have done in the past 6 years with an envelope attached for donations as one possible way to contribute to this kitchen project. That letter and envelopes are available at the entrances to the church and at the parish office. Thank you for your continued generosity to the parish.
