**Note on our weekly offertory:** The Parish Finance Council would like to remind us that our goal each year is to operate without a deficit.

As you know from our weekly reporting of our offertory that we are under our projected offertory budget most weeks and our operating deficit has steadily increased. As of May 31<sup>st</sup>., 2018 our Operating Deficit for the first five months of this year is \$29,026. We hand this information onto you with a deep gratitude for your continued generosity to our parish with all of the many other needs you attend to.

Please note that we are now using 'low gluten' hosts which are 20 parts to 1,000,000 or .002 % gluten. For those who cannot tolerate even this small percentage, we will now have the precious blood available in a cup that no other communicants receive from. Recently the Bishop announced the Parish Changes for the Diocese and had his 'Pastoral letter for Revitalizing the Diocese of Saint John for Discipleship and Evangelization' read at each Mass throughout the Diocese. Copies of the pastoral letter are at the entrances of the church.

The following change is happening for St. Dunstan's:

*Frederickton South, New Maryland and Frederickton Junction (2 Priests).*

*The parishes of St. Dunstan's (Frederickton) and Sts. John and Paul (New Maryland) will be merged into one new parish effective September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018. St. Dunstan's Church and Sts. John and Paul Church will serve as worship sites. St. Columba's Church (Frederickton Junction) will be a mission church of this parish.*

- An evangelizing community that gives Jesus Christ to the world.
- Full churches for Sunday Mass

**Sharing Good News: Everyone's Call**

Did you ever notice how hard it is to keep good news a secret? It's not easy to be quiet when someone is expecting a child. It's hard to keep a lid on the news that someone is in for a big new job. Life is full of leaks when it comes to secret or confidential information. The funny thing about this, is that when it comes to sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ, we often seem to behave as if it were a secret reserved only for ourselves. We seem shy to share it or we think it is a task belonging to someone else.

Good news travels fast and far. Even in the Gospel we hear this weekend, we see the impact of Good News. As we hear today, Jesus often gathers a crowd. Obviously, it's what he says and does that hooks them. We need a new vision of who we are, a realization that we, all of us, are Church. Sharing the Good News belongs to every baptized person.

Recently, on June 6, Pope Francis expressed this broad view of Church as he spoke to the crowd in St. Peter's Square. In speaking about how we understand "Church", he said: "Some think that there are only bishops, the bosses, and then there are the workers. No, the Church is all of us, everyone, each person has their role in the Church, but we are all the Church." He went on to say to the thousands who were gathered: "The Church is we who walk, we who are here in the square. It's everyone."

In presenting Church in this way, Pope Francis was expressing the vision of the Second Vatican Council (Vatican II). In the *Constitution on the Church*, the Council focused on capturing who we are as Church. There we hear again and again that WE, ALL OF US ARE CHURCH. When it comes to sharing the Good News, it is the mission of the whole Church, every baptized person has this mission.

Pope Francis has shared this vision repeatedly. As he wrote, in 2013 in *The Joy of the Gospel*: "In virtue of their baptism, all members of the People of God have become missionary disciples. All the baptized, whatever their position in the Church or their level of instruction in the faith, are agents of evangelization. Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: we no longer say that we are "disciples" and "missionaries", but rather we are always "missionary disciples". (*The Joy...* 120)

The ultimate aim and purpose of restructuring our diocese is that we might be revitalized. This will not happen overnight. But over time it is our hope that we may grow to be the "missionary disciples" we are called to be, sharing the Good News in our lives as well as our words.

**For your reflection some quotes from Marianne D Williamson.** She is an American spiritual teacher, author, and lecturer. She is the founder of [Project Angel Food](#), a meals-on-wheels program that serves homebound people with [AIDS](#) <sup>[5]</sup> in the [Los Angeles](#) area, and the co-founder<sup>[6]</sup> of [The Peace Alliance](#), a grassroots campaign supporting legislation to establish a United States [Department of Peace](#). Williamson serves on the Board of Directors of the RESULTS organization, which works to end poverty in the United States and around the world. Williamson also produces the Sister Giant Conferences, highlighting the intersection of spirituality and politics.

“Our deepest fear is not that we are inadequate. Our deepest fear is that we are powerful beyond measure. It is our light, not our darkness that most frightens us. We ask ourselves, 'Who am I to be brilliant, gorgeous, talented, fabulous?' Actually, who are you not to be? You are a child of God. Your playing small does not serve the world. There is nothing enlightened about shrinking so that other people won't feel insecure around you. We are all meant to shine, as children do. We were born to make manifest the glory of God that is within us. It's not just in some of us; it's in everyone. And as we let our own light shine, we unconsciously give other people permission to do the same. As we are liberated from our own fear, our presence automatically liberates others.”

“Love is what we are born with. Fear is what we learn. The spiritual journey is the unlearning of fear and prejudices and the acceptance of love back in our hearts. Love is the essential reality and our purpose on earth. To be consciously aware of it, to experience love in ourselves and others, is the meaning of life. Meaning does not lie in things. Meaning lies in us.”

“Joy is what happens to us when we allow ourselves to recognize how good things really are.”

“The practice of forgiveness is our most important contribution to the healing of the world.”

“You may believe that you are responsible for what you do, but not for what you think. The truth is that you are responsible for what you think, because it is only at this level that you can exercise choice. What you do comes from what you think.”

“In every community, there is work to be done.  
In every nation, there are wounds to heal.  
In every heart, there is the power to do it.”
